




Completing an assessment



Now that you've registered your assessors and your elephants on the app, we'll go through how to complete an assessment for one of your elephants

Section A - Qualitative Behaviour Assessment (QBA)

Complete these in one day

Four observations, spread across the day, between:

9:00 – 11:00 (9am-11am)


11:00 – 13:00 (11am-1pm)

13:00 – 15:00 (1pm-3pm)


15:00 – 17:00 (3pm-5pm)




Section A, Qualitative Behavioural Assessment. You'll complete this section in one day, making four observations spread across the day, with one observation between 9-11am, one 11am-1pm, one made between 1 and 3pm, and one observation between 3 and 5pm




To begin an assessment, first select the elephant you'll be observing



AND then select 'enter assessment' under Section A - Qualitative Behaviour Assessment.



You will then see a popup screen listing all of the assessors you have registered at your facility



Click on the name of the person doing the current assessment

Reporting Changes

- Elephant's health
- Management or training
- Change in elephants (birth, death, movement)
- Facilities (e.g. new enclosure)
- Anything else



Next you will get a popup screen asking if there have been any changes to that elephant's health, any changes in how you manage that elephant, changes in the other elephants at your facility (such as a birth or death, or an elephant leaving or a new one arriving at your facility, or any changes to the facility itself, such as a newly built enclosure.

You should use this section to mention anything that has happened which you think might have affected your elephants' welfare. Give as much information as possible about what the change

was, and make sure you include the date when it first happened. This is crucial information in order for you to be able to look at the elephant's scores before and after that change happened, so you can see if that change may have affected that elephant's welfare.



In each of the sections, you will see in the lefthand panel, the first item you can click on is 'instructions'. This will give you a short summary of how to complete that section of the tool. If you need more detail, you can refer to the app handbook, which you can view either on your tablet, or online at the EWP website, (www.elephantwelfareproject.org)



And at the lefthand end of the scale for that term is 'not content', meaning the animal appears not content at all. You must decide where on that sliding scale you would rate your elephant for that 1 minute that you just observed them.

You are trying to judge how you think the elephant was feeling at the time - it's emotional state.



to rate your elephant on the app, you can move the slider underneath each adjective by placing your finger on the dot on the left hand edge of the scale, and dragging it across to the right, until you reach the place on the line that best indicates how much you think that adjective applies to how your elephant was feeling and acting during that minute.




Alternatively, you can just tap on the line, in the spot where you want the slider to be. You are deciding where the elephant's demeanour falls along that line, between the two extreme ends of that scale.

Each time you make a one minute observation, you need to rate your elephant on all of these adjectives.








In this part of the video, you will learn how to complete Section B, which involves recording Daytime Behaviours. You will make these observations for three days in a row.


And on each day, you will observe your elephant's behaviour four times a day, at times spread across the day. So you'll observe the elephant between 9 and 11am, 11am to 1pm, 1pm to 3pm, and between 3 and 5pm.




From the home screen, first choose the elephant you'll be observing, from your list of elephants on the lefthand pane




AND then click on 'enter assessment' under Section B – Daytime behaviour, from the righthand pane



You will then see a popup screen listing all of the assessors you have registered at your facility






Next you will see a popup screen asking if there have been any changes to that elephant's health, facility, management or social group

If you have already provided information on changes in one of the other sections, you can select 'no' on this screen, and the information you previously submitted will be transferred across from the other sections.

Otherwise, please provide information on any changes in health, enclosure, management or social group that you think might have affected that elephant's behaviour.

ASSESSMENT C COMPLETE

Every 30 minutes, throughout the night, you must record the elephant’s behaviour. So for example, you would record behaviour at 8pm, 8:30pm, 9 o’clock, and so on, for the rest of the night.

Once you have entered the observation for the last time listed on the app, which is 8 o’clock in the morning, then click the green ‘Assessment C complete’ button at the bottom of the screen, to save all your data.

Time to complete an assessment = 3 days

Three days total

- A. One day (daytime) 
- B. Three days (daytime) 
- C. One night (overnight) 



Overall, it will take you three days to complete one assessment on an elephant.

The four daytime QBA observations for section A could be done on the same day as one of the Section B daytime behavioural observations, you'll just need to collect them at slightly different times, maybe a few minutes apart.


And the overnight observations for Section C can be done some time during the 3 days when you are making daytime observations.




Once you have completed all three sections of the tool, you can submit your data, and you will automatically receive an email with a detailed report on your elephant's behaviour.

You will then see a pop up box asking you for confirmation. If you agree with the terms, click on 'export' and your data will be uploaded.




